Green Thumb Day - Jackson Fisher

The Friends of Riverside Park teamed up with Thomas Johnson Elementary/Middle's greening committee for the student Green Thumb Day on May 2nd. **Green Thumb Day** is an opportunity for the students to learn about and participate in planting activities in flower beds along Heath St. The students planted 200 plants, mulched all of the beds (about 3/4 of a dump truck worth of mulch),weeded, and watered. A core group of middle school students served as mentors to the younger elementary students. **Nancy Baum**, who teaches Pre-K, organized different classes to come out every 30 minutes.

There were 200-250 kids who participated in the planting. Overall, the kids did a fantastic job and have transformed the area in front of the school.

Typically, the school funds the annual spring planting by hosting a plant sale. This year, the school received \$913 from the Parks and People Neighborhood



Greening grant program. The grant money was used to purchase 28 roses, 30 daisies, 30 black eyed susans, and 144 liriope. The grant did not cover mulch so the school and Riverside Neighborhood Association contributed to the purchase of 15 yards of mulch. Additional plant material was acquired from several sources. Tree Baltimore supplied 4 Eastern Redbud trees. **Jon Mayers** from Chesapeake Realty Partners (2 E. Wells/1901 S. Charles) donated material from 2 E. Wells (barberry/

day lillies/shrubs). An ornamental oak and 10 boxwoods were acquired at the Mid-Atlantic Nursery and Trade Show (MANTS). Tools were provided by Parks and People's CGRN toolbank. This event has been very successful over the past 3-4 years and has been supported by many people/organizations. We are looking forward to continuing these efforts again next spring!

Friends of Riverside Park Cleanup: Saturday June 1st 9am-Noon.

We will work on mulching and weeding the entrance flower beds/roses, some maintenance on the Riverside Park sign, picking up trash, and some light pruning. Cleanups are all ages and abilities. Dogs, children, and those with short attention spans are always welcome.

Riverside Park Pool

The Riverside Park pool opens at the end of May. Starting on **May 25** until June 9, the pool will be open on the weekends. The pool will open 7 days a week starting on June 15 and continuing until August 11th. Pool admission is \$2; a season pass costs \$30. General pool hours (open swimming) is 12pm-7pm (Monday-Saturday) and 1pm-6pm (Sunday). Note: The pool is closed daily from 3:30-4pm for safety inspections and employee lunch/break. The pool is offering several programs this year outside of open swimming times (swimming lessons/mommy and me swim times/lap swimming etc). If you are interested, there is some basic info on the Baltimore City Aquatics page. (It should be updated with the current info; however, I would encourage anyone with specific questions to stop by the pool and ask Nikki.) (As of press time, I don't have any additional info to pass on about the pool programs; however, we are trying to meet with them about programs before the pool opens. 




Greetings and peace, Riverside Neighbors.

A few items for everyone who fall under these categories...

Federal Hill Jazz & Blues Wine & Art Festival



Doggy Etiquette

The law states that dogs must be on a leash no longer than six feet. However, as we have recently received several complaints of dogs running up to people walking through the park with no controls or discipline from their owners, I feel that too many people are not respecting the rights and personal space of others. The following guidelines are simple rules of doggy etiquette that I occasionally place in the Riverside Newsletter. I thought it was the perfect time to remind the dedicated dog walkers in the park:

- Rain, snow, sun, knee deep in mud...pick up after your dog. Think of the park as your own yard, because it is. Oh yes, and it is the law!
- Your dog should be firmly under your control for the safety of the dog, and everyone else in the park.
- Your dog should never approach a dog on a leash unless invited by that dog's owner.
- Your dog should never approach people walking through the park without their invitation.
- Doggy playtime should be centered in the middle of grassy areas and not near pedestrian paths.
- Dogs who play too aggressively (growling, biting, etc.) can be frightening to passersby. The dogs should be separated and/or play should be moved to the lower field.
- If your dog breaches etiquette, a simple reprimand to the dog and a sincere apology to the other person will usually diffuse the situation. (Saying "he won't hurt you" only makes people angry)
- Your home's proximity to the park is not a license to open your front door and let your dog go to the park without you. That immediately violates all of the above.

The only way for everyone to enjoy the park is to respect the personal space of others. You wouldn't run up to a stranger in the park and jump on them (hopefully), and neither should your dog. We are fortunate to have a large, wonderful park in which to exercise our dogs, and following these simple suggestions will help to continue everyone's enjoyment of the park.

Dues are Due

RNA is now officially a Non-Profit Public Charity and is exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Contributions to us are now deductible, and we are qualified to receive tax deductible bequests, devises, transfers or gifts. This also means we must start 2013 dues collection. Now that we are non-profit, you cannot vote on any issue without paying dues. They are a very-affordable \$5 a year and can be paid at a neighborhood meeting or by using the tear-off slip below.
