So what have we been doing to work on this?

We have been trying to fill our regular meetings with relevant guest speakers. The recent and upcoming months' speakers have centered on the upcoming state elections. This gives all of us a chance to meet with and ask questions of the candidates that will help shape our state and city for the next few years. After the election cycle, we will have speakers who represent local businesses and events. Good suggestions for speakers are welcome. We have also been mixing in social meetings every few months. The hope is that those who want to ask questions in an informal atmosphere will come out and do so. March's meeting at Captain Larry's will be one of those, so please come join us.

We are also working on improving our communications between meetings and newsletters. We have a Twitter account and Facebook pages that are updated throughout the month with current news. Up until very recently, our Facebook page had been what is known as a 'Fan Page'. On this type of page, posts by our followers were seen by RNA but were not automatically broadcast for the rest of our friends and neighbors. Because we are still learning, it took us a while to figure out that there is a better way to connect the neighborhood. To that end, we recently set up the RNA Neighbor Connect Group on Facebook. This group will allow all of its members to interact more easily. For current events and questions,

this will be the timeliest way to give and receive information. The best part is that it will tap into the whole neighborhood as a resource. As I mentioned, connecting the neighborhood is the goal. Please take the time to join the group (more info on page 4).

Development - Ann Fiocco

Development Committee Goals: RNA seeks to promote responsible development that will enhance life for everyone on the peninsula and within our neighborhood. We want to listen to our residents and balance resident concerns/wishes with the overall best interests of improving city life for everyone. 130/132 E. Barney has been purchased by a new developer. We are confident that this developer will work with our community on their plans. Updates will follow at the next meeting. The property currently housing Matty's Diner on the corner of Fort of Lawrence has been purchased. This property includes the parking lot behind the diner. The developer has no definitive plans as of our newsletter deadline, but we will keep everyone informed as plans develop. Look for demolition to begin on the old funeral home on Fort Ave. This will be developed into 5 rowhomes. Please remember to refer to baltimorehousing.org for any permit questions or concerns.

Parks & Recreation - Jackson Fisher Riverside Trash Cans

The corner trash cans at the Randall entrances are prone to overflow during busy weekends or snow events. According to the labels on the cans, one side is for recycling and one side is for trash. Currently, the city does not provide separate trash and recycling service for the parks so both cans are emptied by the trash crew. If you come across a can that is full, please place the trash into the recycling side of the can. We are working with the city to either re-label the tops or provide recycling pick-up. I will let everyone know if the policy changes; in the meantime, we may as well take advantage of the extra trash can space.

Spring Planning and Friends of Riverside Park Projects

Spring is coming. March is the typical start of the monthly park cleanups and park projects. FORP applied for a \$5,000 Partnerships in Parks grant from the Parks and People Foundation. We will find out in late March if we have received the money. This year, we are hoping to plant a garden at the Heath/Johnson entrance, work on the stonework at Randall/Covington, repair the fence at Heath/Covington, move some trees, and plant various perennials and trees throughout the park. We invite everyone (big and small) to join us on the first Saturday of the month (9-noon). We have the supplies/tools so participants only need to bring gloves. Hope to see you this spring! Crime - Shannon Sullivan

Baltimore City State's Attorney, Gregg Bernstein, attended our February meeting and not only did he address our criminal justice concerns, he asked to come back to our April meeting and provide us with an update. Specifically, he promised to look into the cases of individuals who repeatedly commit crimes in our neighborhood. While most of the arrests are for non-violent offenses, the nature of the crimes negatively impacts the quality of our lives. So please come out to the April meeting for an update on this critical issue.

Also discussed at the February meeting was the recent number of breaking and entering (home burglaries) crimes that have occurred. Sometimes owners left their doors or windows unlocked but in other instances wooden doors were simply kicked-in. Unfortunately, our home was one of them. However, we have a large dog and a very loud alarm system and nothing was taken. In almost all of the other cases, the residents didn't have an alarm and items were removed. And, while I should have more positive news on this topic for the March meeting, I strongly encourage people to remember to lock their windows and doors and invest in an alarm system. Alarm systems can be a deterrent and they also alert the police and your neighbors if there is a problem. And, as a proud new owner of a steel door, I can say that is a good investment too.




