

Daffodils

Civic Works' 12th Annual Ricky Myers Day of Service was Oct 11; it is an annual city-wide event that pairs volunteer groups and park locations together for a day of planting and service projects. This year, Riverside hosted 15 volunteers for a day of daffodil planting along the hill on the Johnson St side of the park. The volunteers claim to have planted 400 bulbs in the two muddy and grass-less rectangles on the hill. We will have to wait until spring to find out if this is the case...

Street Trees

Planting season is here. The city will be out planting trees into empty tree pits and cutting new tree locations. One item that has received some attention recently is the issue of approval. The city does not need approval to plant a new tree in front of your house. As a resident, you do not have the right to refuse the installation of the tree. Street trees are city property planted on city land. Baltimore City has an ambitious long-term goal of expanding the tree canopy, and they have made it clear that they are putting in street trees regardless of citizen objections.



(The correct answer is "2" as it is the only available space)


You are to identify correctly, based on parking etiquette, at which parking space you are to occupy. Good luck! (Answers in next month's newsletter)

Easy Section







Kind of Tricky Section






