

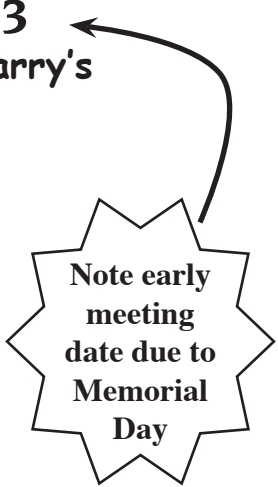
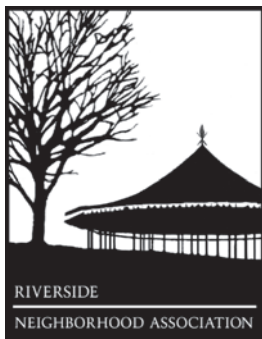

At the April 25 RNA meeting, representatives from BGE gave a presentation on Phase 2 of Operation Pipeline, a large-scale gas main replacement project. Work in South Baltimore, Phase 2 (which includes many homes in Riverside) is scheduled to begin in May. The purpose of Operation Pipeline is to replace aging, deteriorating pipelines with new, larger, and safer gas pipelines. The presentation began with a short video that described the project and what to expect. The easiest way to view the video is to search for "Operation Pipeline BGE" on YouTube. I recommend watching to get a better understanding for the project and be better prepared.

What you need to know--

- When work is ready to begin on your street, you will be notified with a hanger on your door that will have the name and contact information for the contractor doing the work.
- The person authorized to allow BGE to perform the necessary work will need to be home for the initial meeting to assess the current gas meter location, discuss next steps, and answer any questions you may have. Someone to provide access to property and appliances will need to be home for subsequent appointments.
- This a major project with a lot of underground digging, so be prepared for parking restrictions, lane and road closures, construction trucks and equipment, noise, and dust. BGE's goal is to do its best to minimize the inconvenience.
- The BGE contractor will require access to the exterior and interior of your property to begin prep work for the new meter.
- Although the goal is to minimize damage to sidewalks and landscaping when the new service line from the BGE main is installed from the street to the eventual location of the new meter, the work will require a lot of digging that will be temporarily patched.
- You will be contacted again for the installation of the new meter. Be prepared to have all your gas appliances such hot water heaters, furnaces, clothes dryers, ovens and stoves to be off for several hours. Once installed, the contractor will turn your gas service on and thoroughly inspect the work.
- Once all gas mains and meters are replaced for your area, all temporary patching will be restored.

• Your existing meter equipment is not compatible with the new higher-pressure mains, and must be replaced to continue receiving gas service. Responding to appointment requests promptly will speed the completion for your area.

- As always, if you smell gas or suspect a gas leak, immediately go to a safe place and contact BGE at 1-800-685-0123.

BGE recognizes that this process is going to be disruptive to our neighborhood; however, this temporary inconvenience is necessary for safe and efficient service.

Recreation & Parks – *Jackson Fisher* Garden Club Updates

Six dog waste bag dispensers were mounted around the park for the May cleanup. The dispensers hold a couple hundred bags each and should be an improvement over the plastic Ikea bag holders. Since we shifted to the new dispensers, please recycle old grocery bags at the shopping center. In June, we will work on pruning some of the low hanging branches in the park. There will be plenty of branches to move so the more the merrier. The project will start at 9am on June 4th. Bring gloves and water. No tools/experience required.

Community Dumpster

As part of the pruning project, I have requested a roll off dumpster from the city on June 4th. The dumpster will be placed near the Johnson/Barney intersection next to the Riverside Park basketball courts. If you have any household waste or alley trash, the dumpster will be available from 8ish until 2ish. (may fill up before 2 depending on pruning activities.) No hazardous material, liquids, appliances, etc.

Development – *Ann Fiocco*

DOT is beginning a study of Lawrence Street to include Key Highway and Fort Ave. Study will encompass traffic light timing, turn lanes, pedestrian access, and possible bike lanes. Study should be complete in July and a public meeting will be held at that time.

Road and Parking Update – *Dave Urbaneke*

Light Street at Key Highway Intersection Improvements

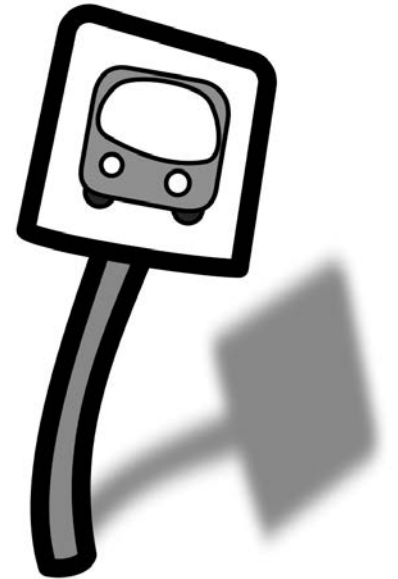
This long-delayed project to improve vehicular and pedestrian safety along Key Highway from the Science Center to Rash Field is currently under design with construction expected to begin in the fall.

Charm City Bikeshare

Beginning this fall, 500 bicycles will be available for short-term rental around the city. They will be placed at 50 stations around Baltimore in an area spanning from the Inner Harbor west to Union Square, north to Charles North, east to Canton and south to Locust Point.

Bus Stop Consolidation/Curb Extensions at Bus Stops

If you haven't noticed, there are 6 bus stops along the 3,000-foot Fort Avenue corridor from Light Street to Lawrence Street, with a stop in each direction for a total of 12 stops. Each stop is approximately 70 feet long, which could accommodate approximately 4 parked cars. There are also 5 bus stops along Light Street from Fort Avenue to Wells Street. I propose to consolidate some of the stops along Fort Avenue. I also propose to redesign several of the stops to consist of a curb extension ("bump-out" or "bus bulb") at each intersection. Rather than a bus pulling out of the travel lane into a bus stop, the bus would remain in the travel lane and stop at the bump-out/curb extension. Although this would create a few extra seconds of delay for motorists waiting behind a stopped bus, this would create approximately 30 additional parking spaces along these two short corridors alone. Shelters (as well as landscaping) could be installed on the curb extensions where they previously could not be installed in the sidewalk. I will run through the details at our April 25 neighborhood meeting to get resident feedback before submitting anything to the City.

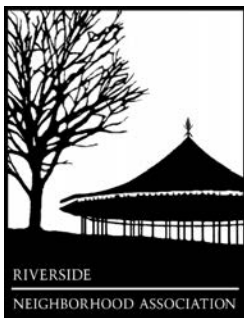
