RNA Helps Field Entry in Kinetic Sculpture Race ~ Jeff Brown

The 20th annual Baltimore Kinetic Sculpture Race will take place on Saturday, May 5. Teams from all across the city will merge artistry and engineering to create mobile sculptures (everything from astronaut cows to gigantic crocodiles) to race all around the Inner Harbor. This wild and fun event has become a local tradition due to the ingenuity of the engineers, the intrepid pilots, and the interesting designs.

The course stretches fourteen miles, from the American Visionary Art Museum on Key Highway, through Federal Hill Park, down Riverside Avenue to Fort Avenue, and then up Key Highway and around the Inner Harbor to Canton Waterfront Park, where teams will test the seaworthiness of their crafts. Assuming they stay afloat, teams will then race back around the harbor to come down Key Highway, where they will visit Fort Avenue for a second time, before the final stretch of Covington Street to the finish line at the AVAM.

In addition to the race course passing through our streets, this year's competition has added significance for Riverside. Our neighborhood association is one of many sponsors for the Digital Harbor High School race team organized by Cathy Strodel. Cathy helped raise five thousand dollars to fund the team, comprised of dozens of students, teachers, faculty, and neighbors to the school. We are one of many neighborhood associations, businesses, and private donors to help this effort to promote collaboration between the students of Digital Harbor High and the South Baltimore Peninsula.

Be sure to come out on Saturday, May 5 to cheer on the students of Digital Harbor High as they try to become this year's Grand Overall East Coast Ace Champion (and not recieve the Golden Dinosaur Award)!

RPP Update

We have received an update from the Parking Authority of Baltimore City (PABC), but first, a few questions have been received about the size of the residential permit parking (RPP) pilot area and why more blocks were not included. In short, getting signatures on petitions can be time consuming, and once issued there is a 120 day deadline for completion.

PABC originally recommended that RNA start with 10 block faces, though we eventually settled on 13 contiguous block faces that are adjacent to RPP areas #19 and #30. Once the pilot area is established, we can immediately begin to issue new petitions and expand the area one block face a time. RNA's intention is to do that as quickly as possible, starting with areas that are immediately adjacent to the pilot area. Any volunteer help we receive will help to expedite the RPP expansion effort. It would be especially helpful to have volunteers who can assist with petitioning their own neighbors on their blocks. Residents are more likely to answer the door or take calls from people familiar to them.

This brings us to the latest news: petitions for the pilot area may be available as early as May, which is sooner than expected. To that end, we need to get organized to collect signatures in the 120 day window as soon as it begins. So far, we only have about half a dozen people who've offered to assist in the pilot area.

Riverside Park Projects

As spring finally takes hold, it is a busy time in the park. Here's a brief update on the various projects that are in the works:

Pollinator Garden - In early April, some of the debris and trash was removed from the pollinator garden near the Covington St service building. Once the weather warms up, new seed will be planted for the area to establish a mix of pollinator friendly plants.

Randall/Johnson Fencing - New garden fencing was purchased and delivered for the Randall/Johnson entrance. Look for a facebook announcement for the installation date (probably June timeframe).

Riverside Sign - The informational signs on the Riverside Park sign should return shortly. The park history sign has been redesigned and is ready for printing. The park map sign is in the works. At this point, we are hoping to have both boards printed and installed within the month.

New Garden in the Pool Area - This year's MANTS plants are going to be planted in the pool area. We acquired some hardy shrubs that would be a perfect addition along some of the pool fencing. If the weather cooperates, the plan is to plant the pool shrubs in early May.

Monthly Garden Club - Traditionally, the Riverside Park garden club meets on the first Saturday of the month from 9am - 1pm to work on the gardens. However, at this time of year, there are a lot of activities going on so we are in the park much more often. If you would like to volunteer with a specific area or garden, please let me know and I can provide some tools, materials, and guidance. 



