### Auto Theft

Auto theft has been down overall this year when compared to last, however the Baltimore Police Department reported a spike during recent weeks. Be proactive. Keep your vehicle doors locked and the windows closed. Don't store any valuable items in your car. Never leave your vehicle with the keys in the ignition. Try to park in well-lit areas. These are just a few simple steps you can take to save yourself the headache and heartache of dealing with a stolen vehicle.

### Dockless Scooters

I'm sure you've all noticed the electric scooters on the streets around the neighborhood. As mentioned in a previous newsletter, these are part of a pilot program operated by the city's Department of Transportation and the two scooter companies, Bird and Lime. The program started in August and will run through February of next year. Patrons can pick up scooters anywhere they find them and ride to just about any location within the city limits. All you need is a smartphone, a credit or debit card, and a valid driver's license or state ID. At the conclusion of the program, the city will evaluate its success and determine whether it should be expanded to allow other scooter companies, and potentially even bicycles. ### Fitness Stations

After several delays, the fitness stations are finally on the way. Final drawings and layout specs were sent to the contractors in late November. The site preparation is scheduled to occur in early December and the equipment should be installed shortly thereafter. The two locations, near the playground and behind the softball field, should be operational in time for everyone's New Year resolutions. Each fitness station will have 5-6 pieces of equipment that target different muscle groups and offer varying levels of resistance. Balt City Rec and Parks received a grant to install exercise stations in a few of the city parks; Riverside was one of the lucky recipients.

### St Ignatius Day of Service

Thank you to the students from St Ignatius who helped clean, prune, and plant some of the gardens in Riverside Park. For their annual pre-Thanksgiving Day of Service, the students worked on the rose bushes near the flagpole and planting a new garden inside the pool area. The students filled 20 trash bags, planted 14 perennials, and spread 10 bags of mulch.

### Scout Park Clean-Up

Girl Scout Troop #2030 and Girl Scout Troop #11024 helped prepare the park's younger trees for winter. Both troops help spread mulch at the base of trees throughout the park.

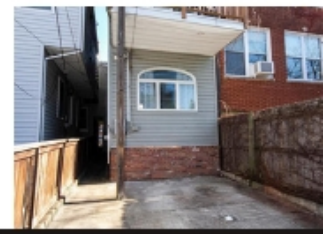

## A Special Message from Salem Lutheran

Dear community,

I'm thinking about the rash of violence across the country over the past few weeks. Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh. A yoga studio in Florida. A bar in Thousand Oaks, CA.

It's heavy. The weight we all feel when we learn of yet another violent death. Yet another mass shooting. It's heavy, and so I understand the desire to put that weight down. To turn away. To walk away. I understand being frozen by fear that it could happen here next. I share your anger and frustration. I share an increasing inability to even process the magnitude of the losses; the news washing over us all, seeming to mean a little less each time. Another shooting. And another. And Another.

On November 4th, Baltimore Ceasefire hosted a vigil for those who have died violently in Baltimore in 2018. I confess that I felt numb for much of the vigil, as though this is a thing that we do--we go to vigils--but what then comes of it? I confess that I was feeling a bit hopeless.

But then the leaders of the vigil--a group of teenagers, each of whom had lost someone dear to them--asked us to speak the names of the 265 dead. They spoke a name and those gathered repeated it. 265 times.

We stood outside of City Hall and--led by Baltimore's youth--spoke the names of the 265 lives claimed by violence in the city this year, reclaiming those lives by candle light and love and the dignity of remembering that they lived. And like those standing outside of Lazarus' tomb in the gospel of Mark, we wept. I believe Jesus wept, too. And like that same tomb, we were cracked open.

I understand better now the danger of becoming numb. The danger of letting victims of violence go unnamed, become statistics. Of reading the news and then setting it aside as though there's nothing to be done. Violence--these increasingly frequent shootings locally and nationally--is radical evil come among us and it is hard to bear.

It's heavy, but these people who are dying are people who lived and we can't abandon them. We can't help but carry them with us. And so even as we mourn I want to share words of strength, courage, and hope from Baltimore Ceasefire--words I needed to hear. They are, for me, a prayer and a kind of mantra:

Vibrate higher. Don't be numb. Promote peace.

Peace, indeed.

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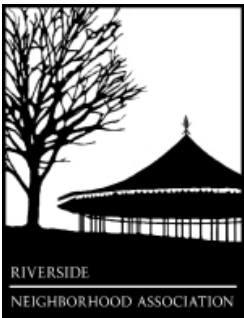
