# Love Thy Neighbor - Heather Chiaro

Getting to know your neighbors can be beneficial to both you and your neighbors. I'm not saying you need to break bread with them, but since we're all Riverside residents and we all generally desire and strive for the same objectives – a safe, crime-free, and clean community -- it might be helpful to get to know those around you. Neighbors can help you out in so many ways, and if we all work together and be neighborly, it just makes being at home that much more enjoyable.

#### **Dues are Due**

RNA is now officially a Non-Profit Public Charity and is exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Contributions to us are now deductible, and we are qualified to receive tax deductible bequests, devises, transfers or gifts. This also means we must start 2013 dues collection. Now that we are non-profit, you cannot vote on any issue without paying dues. They are a very-affordable \$5 a year and can be paid at a neighborhood meeting or by using the tear-off slip below.
