Spring Projects Have Begun - Shane Laporte

The long cold winter is over and it finally looks and feels like Spring – plants are blooming, runners are running, kids are playing. It is a great time of year in Riverside.

However, some of the increased activity this year will add to the demands of city living. Those of us who have been living through the gas line repairs on our streets for the past few weeks have already had a chance to experience this. The inconvenience of blocked streets, increased noise, and construction grime are noticeable. However, please keep in mind that these are short-term issues that will lead to long-term benefits. There are also a few other street projects to keep an eye out for: the long awaited sidewalk adjacent to the Shopper's on Heath St. will be coming soon, as will some curb modifications around the park. Undoubtedly, these projects will also have some of the typical temporary construction inconveniences. Please be patient as the city and contractors work hard to improve the infrastructure in our neighborhood. For all items that go beyond being an inconvenience, please reach out to the city immediately.

Besides these special projects, we have the typically nice-weather increase in activity in the area as well. Sports leagues are back in session and road race season is starting up. We like that these races occur in our neighborhood. They help to raise money and awareness for good causes and bring people into the neighborhood to support our local businesses. However, some of the recent routes have been difficult for residents in certain parts of the neighborhood. RNA has worked with the city to help minimize the impact of these races in the neighborhood by using smarter routes that do not trap folks at (or away from) home for several hours.

With the return of nice weather, RNA was finally able to get out do some work at the park on the first Saturday of April. We were able to get some trees planted and moved, and perform a good general cleaning. We had a good turnout of volunteers, but can always use more. We have more projects lined up in the future and hope to see you there.

Development - Ann Fiocco

Development Committee Goals: RNA seeks to promote responsible development that will enhance life for everyone on the peninsula and within our neighborhood. We want to listen to our residents and balance resident concerns/wishes with the overall best interests of improving city life for everyone.

130/132 E. Barney has been purchased by a new developer. Demolition has begun on this property as it will become 2 homes, reverting back to its original status as two lots.

The property currently housing Matty's Diner on the corner of Fort and Lawrence has been purchased. This property includes the parking lot behind the diner. It also includes 832 E. Fort (Matty's is 834-838), which the developer purchased from the resident who had lived there. There have been many rumors flying around the neighborhood regarding this property, and I would like to share

some facts. The home at 832 was purchased at fair market value, not some low-ball scamming of the resident. Matty's is moving into Southside Marketplace, in the corner by the Pet Valu. The developer has no definitive plans as of our newsletter deadline, but I will be meeting with the developing group at the end of April. We will keep everyone informed as plans develop.
