

can drag out over several months or more, sometimes to the point that the answer to the question, 'What is RNA working on?' seems to stay the same for quite some time. Examples of this were the long struggles for a sidewalk by Shoppers on Heath and the seizure of 1701 Light St, as well as the current ongoing saga of permit parking. These are items of keen interest to the neighborhood, but each incremental step along the way makes for boring conversation.

This month has been different, to say the least, as we have had a couple items that are urgently interesting. While beyond RNA's borders, the late night stabbing that occurred in the area set everyone on edge. The unease was heightened by a confusing set of postings on social media that led people to believe there were multiple incidents. The unease was further heightened by two very real assaults in Otterbein. Adding to the situation was the perception that information from the police was coming out slowly. RNA and our neighboring associations met with the Captain of the Southern District to discuss this. Two key points came up in the meeting. First, because the initial event occurred so late at night,

there were nearly no eyewitness accounts. This, along with the victim initially being unable to speak with police due to his medical condition, slowed the gathering of specific details. The second take away was that, while RNA received timely general information, the police did not have a good contact list for some of the other peninsula associations and the information did not get to all of the places that it should have. Since then, the contact list has been updated. While we all hope that incidents like this do not happen in our typically very safe neighborhood, we expect that communication will be better in the future if they do occur.

The second big news item in the past month is the City Council vacancy that was created when Bill Cole resigned to take on a new role at the Baltimore Development Corporation. News of the pending departure came in early August but the resignation was not official until the beginning of September. This is the first time that a council replacement

will be appointed under a new set of protocols aimed to increase the input of the district's residents on the decision. The process will be happening quickly with the committee appointed within a week of the official resignation and a public hearing for all candidates set for





Here's what you need to know:


- The election will take place at our monthly meeting on Monday, September 29th at 7pm at Salem Lutheran Church.

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
