

Democratic Mayoral Candidates Debate - John G. Paré Jr.

The Riverside Neighborhood Association along with the National Federation of the Blind, the League of Women Voters of Baltimore City, Federal Hill Neighborhood Association, Federal Hill South Neighborhood Association, Key Highway Community Association, Locust Point Civic

Association, and the South Baltimore Neighborhood Association sponsored a Democratic Mayoral debate on March 3, 2016.

The candidates, pictured in the photo from left to right, Nick Mosby, Patrick Gutierrez, Cindy Walsh, DeRay Mckesson, Calvin Allen Young, III, Elizabeth Embry, Carl Stokes, Gersham Cupid, Catherine Pugh, Wilton Wilson, David Warnock, and Sheila Dixon shared their solutions to the issues raised by Peninsula residents. Tom Hall of WYPR moderated the debate and did an excellent iob of facilitatina meaninaful conversations from such a large and diverse field of candidates.

The candidates addressed plans to solve Baltimore's vacant properties problem, discussed the property tax rate (which is

double that of surrounding counties), policies to address racial and socioeconomic disparities in the city, policies that affect Baltimore citizens with disabilities, budget priorities and the Department of Recreation and Parks, and plans for the Baltimore City school system to ensure all students receive a quality education.





Buy: Swing by the park and score some new-to-you goods while enjoying Riverside Park.



REMINDER:

You must be registered with a party to vote in the Maryland Primary Elections on 4/26/2016.

The deadline to register or change your party affiliation is 4/5/2016. You must register a party affiliation to be eligible to vote in this year's Primaries for US President, US Senate, Baltimore City Mayor, and Baltimore City Council.

To change your party affiliation you can use Maryland's Online Voter Registration



System (OLVR) or submit a new voter registration application or a signed written request to your local board of elections.


