

To Help or Not to Help: Tips for Interacting with Your Blind Neighbors

With the National Federation of the Blind headquarters located right here in Riverside, there is a good chance you have encountered one or more blind people walking around the neighborhood. You may sometimes wonder about the best thing to do when you see a blind person about to walk into a trash can or standing at a street corner.

Should you offer assistance? Should you hold them by the arm and guide them across the street? Is it okay to pet their guide dog? Below are a few helpful things to keep in mind that will be appreciated by most blind people.

First, it is okay to use the term "blind person." The National Federation of the Blind teaches people that it is respectable to be blind and the use of euphemisms like partially sighted and visually impaired is not necessary. Additionally, not all blind people are totally blind. Many blind people have some remaining vision. I have some remaining vision myself but not enough to be able to see curbs, steps, tricycles, and other possible obstacles. That is why I use a long white cane when walking about the neighborhood.

Second, at no point should you feel obligated to tell a blind person about an upcoming ground level obstacle. More often than not, we will be able to safely detect and avoid such obstacles through the use of our canes. However, it is very helpful to mention low-hanging branches, signs, or any other obstacles that our canes will not be able to detect. When you do see a blind person, it is helpful to say hello. That way the blind person will know you are in the area and can try to navigate around you.

Third, If the blind person is new to the area or just visiting (the NFB gets approximately 3,000 visitors per year), he or she might ask you for directions or assistance. In these cases, any assistance you are able to offer will be greatly appreciated. Generally, it is best not to give more assistance then is requested. Doing so can seem more patronizing than helpful. In other words, give the assistance that is asked for. When a blind person asks you for directions, then provide them as you would to anyone else (although it's useful to remember that indicating direction by pointing or gesturing probably won't be helpful). If a blind person does ask you to guide them across the street or along the sidewalk, you should allow the blind person to touch the back of your elbow. You should not grab, push, or pull the blind person or her cane.

Fourth, when you see a blind person using a guide dog, you should not in any way interact with the dog. If the guide dog is wearing its harness, it is working and is trained to ignore you. Please be sure to also keep other dogs away from the guide dog. The only time a guide dog can be treated like any other dog is when its harness is removed.

Finally, if you are not sure of the best thing to do when you encounter a blind person in the neighborhood and think he or she might need or want assistance, just ask. We don't bite.






